2. What are the three criteria for a woman being selected as an Inductee into the CWHF? Who can nominate? When?

3. Find four medical doctors in the Hall of Fame. What year were they born?

4. Name the Inductee who was one of the nine students that integrated her school in Little Rock, Arkansas. Why did she come to Colorado?

5. Find two women who trained to be astronauts in the Hall. Who was the first American woman astronaut to work on the International Space Shuttle?

6. What Colorado Judge was instrumental in allowing women to become female FBI agents? How did she make this happen?

7. Name three Inductees who had remarkable accomplishments in sports fields. What field of sports did each one participate in?

8. What is a suffragist? Find three in the CWHF website and list them?

9. Which Inductee appeared on Jerry Lewis' Muscular Dystrophy Telethon? How did she feel about her experience later in life?

10. Which Colorado District Court Judge was the first Latina from Colorado to be admitted to Harvard University Law School?

11. Find a woman in a technical field who nominated many other women for local and national honors. What is her professional title?

12. Find a woman who founded the adoption agency that has helped over 10,000 abandoned Chinese children find homes in America.

13. Which Inductee was the President and CEO of Girl Scouts – Mile Hi Council from 1982 to 2007?

14. Which world-renowned teacher of leadership skills came to America from Nicaragua on a banana boat?

15. Name two Inductees in the entertainment/arts field. What is each woman's specialty?

16. Name the Inductee who opened an amusement park in Denver after she moved to Denver. Hint: The amusement park is still operational in a different location.

17. Find three Native American Inductees and list which tribe they come from. How did each of them make a difference in early Colorado?

18. Name three women who have earned PhDs or EdDs. Identify an accomplishment for each of them.
